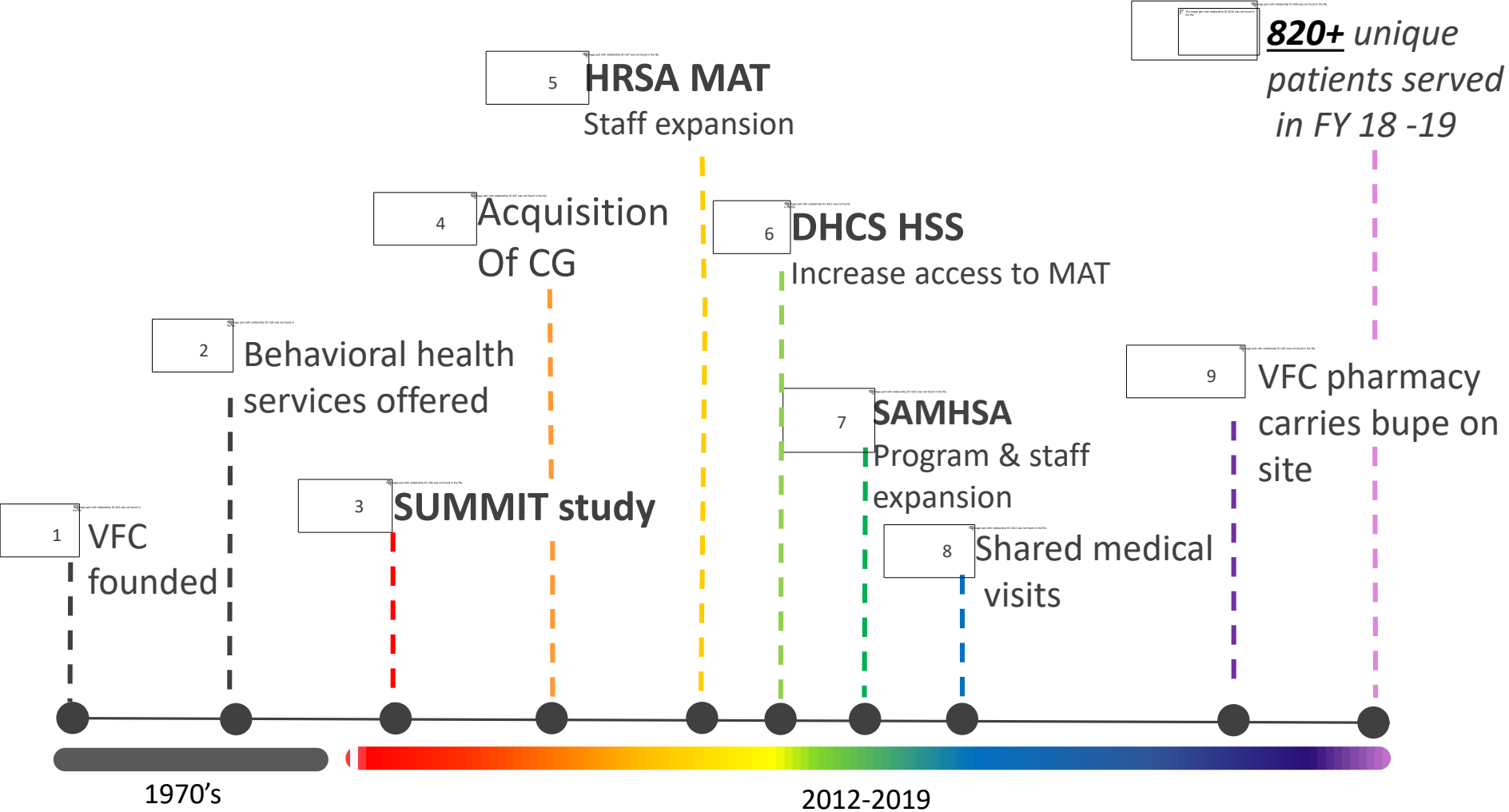

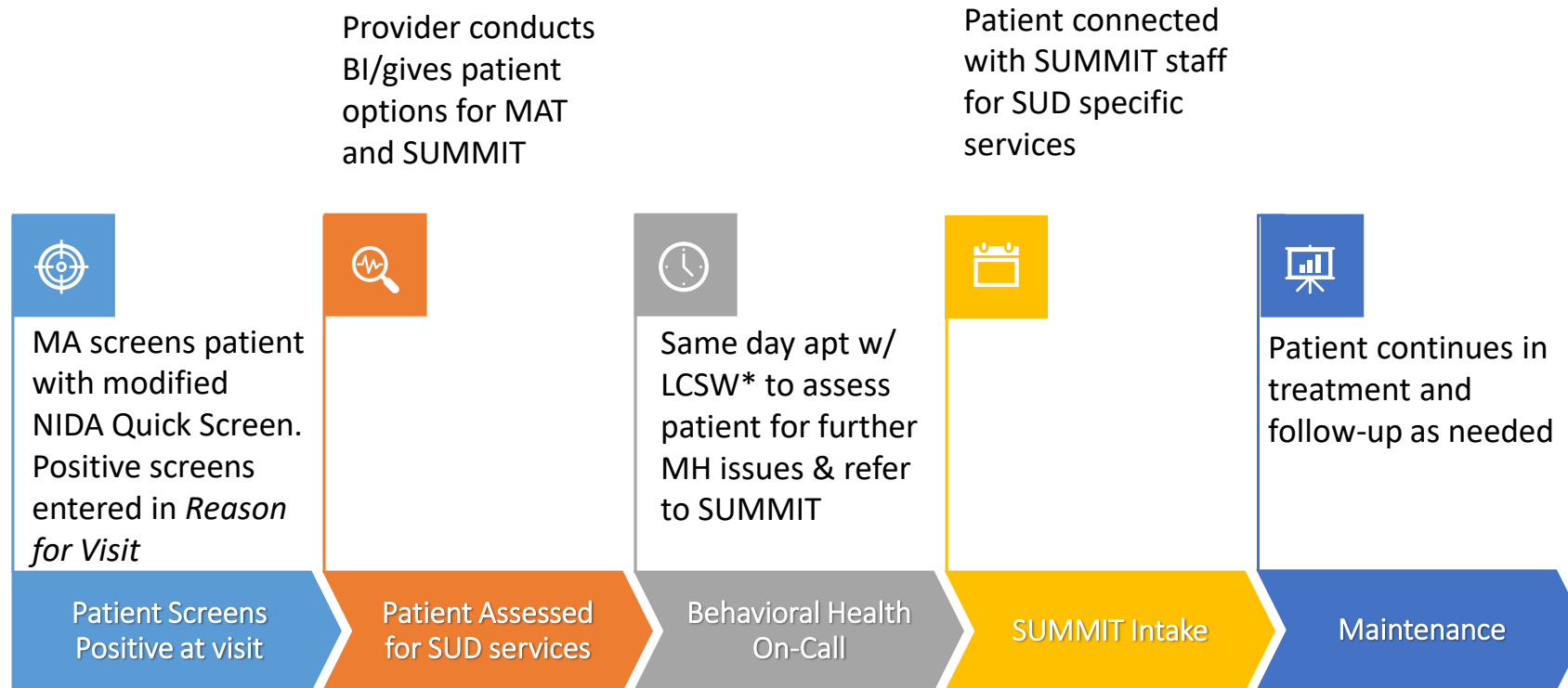


Point of Access Workflow
