



Support the sustainability of the health care safety net to serve communities impacted by COVID-19 by supporting continued reimbursement for telehealth



Strategies

- Training & technical assistance: Develop and disseminate training & technical assistance to enable safety net providers to effectively institutionalize virtual care capabilities
- Engagement: Catalyze wide engagement of safety net health care providers in transformation activities through grants that will enable them to dedicate time and resources to the activities.
- Advocacy: Support continued reimbursement for virtual care modalities.
- KP expertise: Translate and disseminate KP's virtual care best practices.
- Health care for the homeless providers: Support deep practice transformation for providers serving people experiencing homelessness and at risk for COVID-19.

Virtual Care Innovation Network

Redesign virtual care to expand and strengthen access to high-quality care enabling all patients to benefit from these services.







Program Tracks Virtual Care Innovation Network







Advance a specific project to improve virtual care delivery for a population who faces significant barriers accessing care.

Program Offerings

Applied Project Track

- Content webinars that teach tools that support the innovative improvement process
- Content webinars that highlight experts from the field (including Kaiser Permanente)
- Virtual events to learn from peers across the country
- Virtual site visits highlighting exemplars from across the country
- Access to coaching sessions
- Access to online learning and sharing platform and toolkits
- Grant funding: between \$20,000 \$75,000 depending on state and focus





Participant Expectations

Applied Project Track

The goal of this track is to advance a project to develop new approaches to engage patients experiencing barriers to care (i.e., homelessness, limited English proficiency, low technology literacy, etc.)



Identify a core project team (4-6 people) that will design, test, and implement solutions to improve virtual care delivery.



Participate in all program activities (i.e., content webinars, virtual site visits, and best practice sharing sessions).



Participate in required program evaluation activities.

Required Evaluation Activities

Applied Project Track

The purpose of the evaluation is to support teams to understand their progress over the course of the program and to understand how the virtual care efforts are advancing and sustaining across all participating organizations and regions.



Submit virtual care utilization data at 3 points for primary care and behavioral health segmented by modality of care, payer, language.



Participate in no more than 2 phone interviews during the program.



Submit survey responses at 2 points during the program.







Who is Eligible?

Applied Project Track

Safety-net health care organizations that have one, or more, of the following designations:

- Federally qualified health centers (FQHC) 330 program grantees, including 330H grantees
- Federally qualified health center (FQHC) look-alikes
- Primary care providers who serve people experiencing homelessness and are members of National Health Care for the Homeless Council (NHCHC)

Organizations must also meet the following criteria:

- Have providers actively using an electronic medical record system
- Have one clinic site located within a Kaiser Permanente service area
- Have a dedicated team focused on testing & implementing new approaches

Virtual Care Innovation Network







Engage with peers to discuss and solve challenges related to providing and sustaining virtual care.

Program Offerings

Clinic Connection Track

- Monthly peer-learning webinars to discuss critical challenges
- Topics discussed will be co-designed with selected organizations
- Access to online resources, tools, and a platform to support peer sharing and learning
- Grant funding: ranges between \$7000 \$27,000 depending on region and focus



Participant Expectations

Clinic Connection Track

This track is designed for organizations who are most interested in engaging with their peers to discuss and solve specific challenges.



Participate in monthly peer-to-peer sharing sessions focused on best practice sharing and troubleshooting challenges.



Participate in required program evaluation activities.



Option to participate in select Applied Project Track activities such as virtual site visits, webinars and peer-sharing conversations.

Clinic Connection Track




A community health collaboration founded by KAISER PERMANENTE.

Over the course of just weeks, the COVID-19 pandemic dramatically accelerated the pace at which health care organizations across the nation adopted and expanded virtual care. To keep both their patients and employees safe, health care providers completely restructured their services, pivoting from in-person to remote patient visits at record speed. For these organizations, this shift has been transformational — they've adopted new



technology, overhauled workflows, and redefined team member roles. At this point, organizations have proven virtual care can be an option for safety net providers and their patients; what comes next is ensuring that virtual care can be sustained and expanded upon. This will require redesigning initial workflows to ensure equitable access, reduce provider burnout, prepare patients to engage virtually, and advocate for policy and payment reform.
