






Change in IMAT-PC Total Score from Baseline to Midpoint by Team

(N=18)






Average Baseline and Midpoint IMAT-PC Total Scores (N=18)


IMAT Dimension: Health Equity Items

IMAT Dimension: Trauma-Informed Care Items








Adoption: X-Waivered MOUD Prescribers (N=15)






Adoption: Active MOUD Prescribers (N=15)


Identification of New StUD Patients
