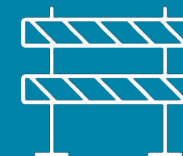

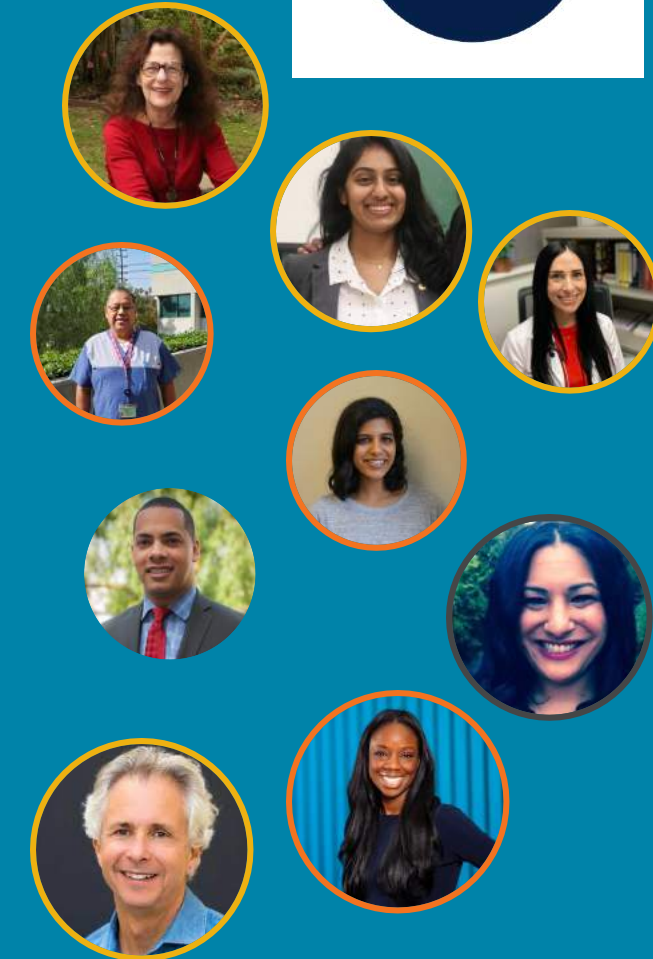

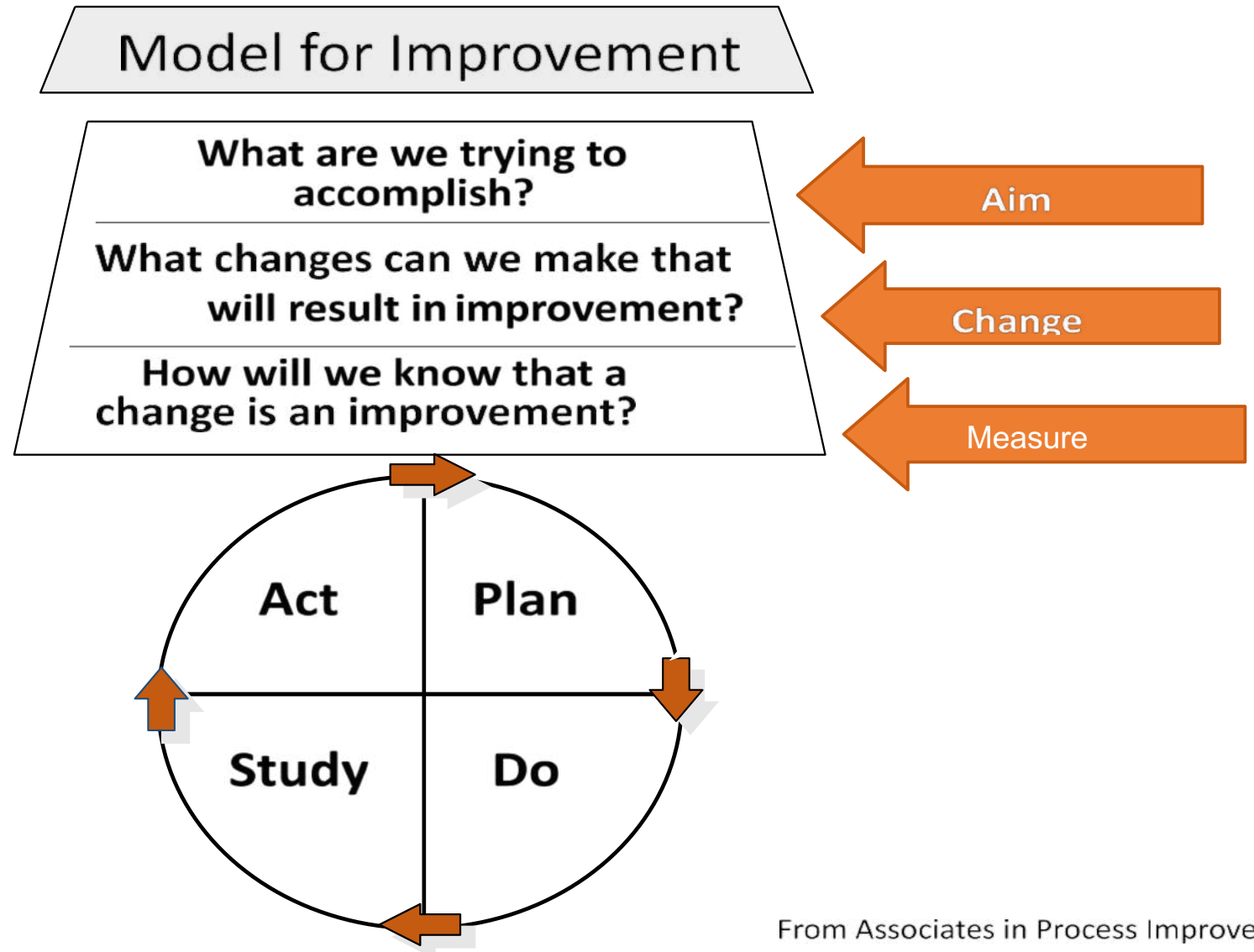

Project Aim
(SMARTIE)

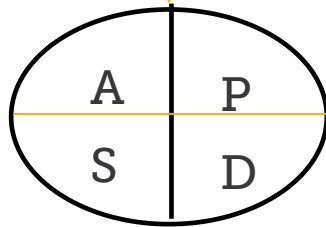
Your overall project aim is the “why” and what you hope to accomplish in the program.

Sub-Aims
(SMARTIE)

Your sub-aims support your overall aim and are aligned with the TRIADS Framework. There are 5 core CALQIC sub-aims. Your team will set your additional sub-aim(s) to address relational healing and equity.

Change Activities &
Measures

These are the big changes and activities you’ll make over the course of the program. TRIADS is a great source for changes/activities!



We’ll break down the big changes and activities into smaller ones to test out and see what works. This isn’t part of the roadmap and we’ll cover it in Phase 2.

Developing an Overarching Aim Statement



Answer the question: *What do you hope to accomplish in CALQIC by October 31, 2021?*

Tips for clear aim statements:

- Define the target population (who is specifically impacted by the aim?)
- Have a main measure and target (i.e., achieve a specific threshold)
- Time specific (by when?... October 31, 2021 or earlier?)
- **SMARTIE**: **S**pecific, **M**easurable, **A**mbitious, **R**elevant, **T**ime-bound, **I**nclusive, **E**quitable.





Example: Overarching Aim

Thrive organization recognizes the impact of ACEs on the health and wellbeing of our patients and staff, and believes in a healing, relational, and equity centered approach toward screening and responding to ACEs. To that end, Thrive Clinic will improve ACEs screening in all three clinic sites using the PEARLS tool for pediatric patients 0-3 in well-child visits from 20% to 60% by October 31, 2021.
