### The Design Process Simplified into Four, (Non-Linear) Steps

- 1. Understand the problem's context through people's perspectives and experience.
- 2. Identify patterns in your qualitative data to help refine and reframe the problem as an opportunity (a positive lens).
- 3. Generate lots of ideas with stakeholders and prioritize which ideas to test first.
- 4. Build and test your ideas, in draft form, with real people.





### CLOSING THE REFERRAL LOOP WITH LOCAL NON-PROFITS & CBOS

Using Aunt Bertha, a web-based technology that lists social service programs in our community, together the Health Center and local non-profits can close the referral loop.

## RESPONDING TO THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC WITH COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Opioid addiction is a critical problem for our community, families and neighbors yet is complex and messy and requires a thoughtful understanding of our communities underlying forces. WCHC & 16 other local CBOs are working together to find leveraging opportunities to tackle this systemic issue.

# PARTNERING WITH A LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO ADDRESS CHILDHOOD ADVERSITY

After conducting a qualitative analysis with GSD to understand truancy and absenteeism we found that trauma was the underlying theme however, we also heard that there was a lack of behavioral health providers at the school and that there was need for social emotional support for students and their families.

 By engaging the stakeholders you are designing for and co-creating with them the projects you advance are more likely to be sustained and spread.

Observation Shadowing Show + Tell Interviews

Collect quotes, photos, and video from observational, shadowing, and interview research.

Make sense of what you documented and learned from your research.

Collaborative Cycle **Empathy Mapping** Journey Mapping

Analyze qualitative research and convey patterns using visual frameworks.

Refine and focus the scope of your challenge based on key insights from your research.

"How Might We..." Statements Analogous Examples

Articulate your challenge in a concise, focused, and optimistic way.

Dream up many ideas to address the challenge. Draft a plan for how you'll test key features of your best ideas with stakeholders.

Brainstorming 2x2 Matrix Solution Mapping

Encourage people with diverse perspectives to contribute ideas. Prioritize which ideas to try first, and which specific elements to build and test.

Make quick, rough drafts of your ideas. Get the examples in front of people and incorporate their

feedback -- repeat!

Paper Prototypes Storyboarding Role Play

Create and test at least three variations on your best idea(s) using sketches, scripts, mock-ups, and other tangible formats.

Communicate with people outside of your core team about your project and why it's worth doing.

7-Part Pitch Structure Calculating Value Video Storytelling "I Like I Wish, I Wonder"

Present a compelling story about your challenge to organizational leadership, and propose next steps.




# Catalysts receive the training, time, and space to be innovative.





### Eligibility Criteria for Free Enrollment and Stipend

#### 501(c)3 non-profits in CA:

- (1) Nonprofit organizations providing social services to improve physical, mental, social, environmental, or economic well-being in underserved communities.
- (2) Safety net healthcare organizations that provide primary care services may also apply in partnership with nonprofit organizations, and the team must include representatives from both organizations.

Must apply in teams of three (or more).

All team members must attend all three workshops.

Team must include role(s) impacted by the project.

New organizations have priority.

Multi-organization teams are allowed.

If you don't meet these criteria, you can still participate on a fee basis. **Email us** to learn more.

- Strong Team
- + Includes someone who is positioned to drive change in the organization.
- + Includes someone who has first-hand perspective into the challenge or will be responsible for executing the project after the program is over.
- + Excited and curious individuals!
- + Great to have an "extended team" of people who will be included in project activities but don't attend the workshops.
- + Can commit 4-6 hours per week to the project.


- Committed Leadership and Resources
- + Connects the project to organizational and community priorities.
- + Able to protect 4-6 hours per week for 6month program duration.
- + Committed to program and invested in building the skillset on their team.
- + Willing to give the team time and space to explore before getting into "fix it" mode or jumping to solutions.
- + Willing to be brought along in the Catalyst experience and provide feedback to the team.

- CompellingProject Topic
- + Issue is unsolved. You are open to exploring a diverse ideas to approach the problem.
- + Topic is aligned with community priorities.
- + Topic is aligned with the organization's priorities.
- + Project is small to medium in scope.
  This means setting realistic expectations with your sponsors about what's achievable in six months.
- + Project is not on a tight deadline.

  Leadership can wait until June 2020 to start implementing.
