



Program Background

Addiction Treatment Starts Here Foundational Work

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For 6 years, CCI worked with ~100 primary care health centers in California to design new or expand existing programs to provide medications for addiction treatment (MAT).



Number of active MAT prescribers increased by 191 providers, equivalent to more than two active prescribers per participating clinic.



Combined increase of >2,199 patients receiving MAT. Many participants doubled or tripled the number of patients accessing MAT for OUD.



Improvements across 7 dimensions (e.g., Infrastructure, clinic culture & environment, patient identification & initiating care, care delivery, care coordination, workforce, etc.), by developing policies and procedures, conducting clinic-wide trainings on stigma, and more.

CCI's 2023-2024 ATSH Programming

Equity Collaborative

- 16-month program
- 20 health centers
- Mature MAT programs to expand their existing medication for addiction treatment (MAT) programs with a deepened focus on addressing health inequities in and developing community partnerships

Learning Network

- 15-month program
- Alumni network geared towards the general improvement and sustainability of MAT programs through a less intensive and completely virtual platform





Program Design & Activities

Addiction Treatment Starts Here Learning Network Program

Recognizing that sites with mature MAT programs can benefit from continued peer learning,

CCI designed a 15-month initiative for previous Addiction Treatment Starts Here and Treating Addiction in the Primary Care Safety Net teams.

The Learning Network will begin in March 2023 and conclude in June 2024



Addiction Treatment Starts Here Learning Network Goal:

Facilitate a virtual peer learning environment that will offer an array of technical assistance that helps teams:

Expand access to MAT and create sustainable models for ongoing MAT program expansion

Address emerging issues in caring for patients with OUD specifically, and SUD more generally



Develop new program capabilities through peer sharing, problem solve around shared challenges, and learn promising practices from exemplar sites



Have access to equity and community partnership tools and online resources made available through ATSH's Equity-Centered Community Learning Collaborative

Free Technical Assistance

- Learning community of peers
- > Quarterly small-group coaching
- Consulting on your current program needs, e.g., patient retention, harm reduction strategies, QI/ spread/ evaluation
- Access to virtual site visits, a virtual Learning Session, the MAT Bootcamp, and other virtual learning tools on the ATSH Resource Hub

- Participation in the Learning Network peer learning community by sharing successes and failures

Program Offerings and Activities

Quarterly Webinars/Coaching	4 quarterly 90-minute webinars for small group coaching and peer problem solving sessions. Coaching TA in MAT expansion and MAT care.
Learning Session	One virtual learning session will be offered (attendance is optional)
Peer Forums	Virtual role-based peer forums, e.g., one group for nurses, another for prescribers, or SUD counselors, etc. A platform to continue to learn with and from peers about ways to continue to improve your MAT program.
Virtual Site Visits	Opportunity to learn from sites with mature MAT programs, that center equity and racial justice
Evaluation	Complete periodic surveys: we ask the completion of periodic online surveys to gain insights into progress being made by the team and the impact of technical assistance provided
Community Engagement	An online community to share resources and get timely questions answered







Participant Expectations

Attend all quarterly webinars and actively share challenges, opportunities, bright spots, and questions with fellow network participants. This sharing can be done via participation in learning events and using the listserv

Participate as a dedicated team. At least 2 individuals are required to commit to the Learning Network to promote continuity. Ideally teams are multidisciplinary and represent the many functions needed for a successful MAT program. We recommend that teams include a prescriber and a frontline staff person

Complete periodic surveys to assess experiences in the Learning Network



What Makes a Strong Application:

Commitment	Committed to participate in Learning Network events (e.g., quarterly webinars, forums, office hours)
Share Lessons Learned	Commitment to actively and openly share approaches and lessons learned with other teams
Team Engagement	Representation from a multi-disciplinary team (e.g., a team that includes participation from different roles, including prescribers, front-line staff, and senior leaders)






